

World Book Day



On Friday 3rd March, we will be celebrating 'World Book Day'. To mark this event, we are asking the children to bring their favourite book to school and dress in their pyjamas. Please ensure they come to school in suitable footwear. If it is your child's PE session on that day, then they will need to wear their trainers as normal.

The Scholastic Book Fair will be visiting Lammack Primary School from Wednesday 1st March until Tuesday 7th March. This will be available at the end of the school day in the Key Stage Two hall. If your child would like to browse or purchase any of the vast array of books, please come along. The children will be given a book token which can be used against the purchase of a new book.

Attendance



Good attendance at school is not just valuable, it's essential. Going to school is directly linked to improved exam performance which should in turn lead to further learning opportunities and better future prospects. We currently have a number of children who are persistently absent from school and a group of children whose attendance has fall well below 95%.

If your child is at school for only 90 per cent of the school year then they will have missed 19 days - almost four whole weeks of school.

For primary-age children, this can mean almost 120 guided learning hours. This is a big gap for any child to make up.

Please support us by ensuring your child attends school each day and avoid unnecessary absences.

You can help prevent your child missing school by:

- having a routine from an early age and sticking it to it
- making sure your child understands the importance of good attendance and punctuality
- making sure they understand the possible implications for themselves and you as a parent if they don't go to school
- taking an interest in their education ask about school work and encourage them to get involved in school activities
- discussing any problems they may have at school and letting their teacher or headteacher know about anything that is causing concern
- not letting them take time off school for minor ailments or holidays during term time

To avoid disrupting your child's education, you should arrange (as far as possible), appointments and outings:

- after school hours
- at weekends
- during school holidays

Term time holidays

Term time holidays have been increasing over the last number of years. Parents should make every effort to make sure that their child does not miss school due to holiday plans. We cannot authorise leave during term-time and penalty notices are being issued to families who choose to ignore the guidance.

Currently, our Inclusion Officer is monitoring the absence of children. Meetings and home visits will be arranged to discuss concerns with families during the course of next half term.

Parking

Our Parent Governors have reported that parking has improved on Lammack Road during busy periods of the school day. Thank you to all the parents who have listened to the advice and are now parking in safe places on Lammack Road and also making more use of the QEGs car park. It really does contribute to a much calmer and more pleasant experience for all road users. It has been reported that Whinney Lane is still chaotic, with some parents parking in the middle of the road, blocking driveways or parking on yellow lines. We need to all work together to keep everyone safe.
