## National Numeracy Day

On Wednesday, the children took part in National Numeracy Day. Year 6 spent the morning investigating magic squares with Mrs S. Saleh one of our parent governors. Mrs Saleh works for KPMG a major accountancy company. She worked with all the year 6 children to investigate numbers and their origins. The children had a fantastic time and worked hard to stretch their knowledge to key stage 3 maths ready for secondary school.

They found out about the history of magic squares, where they originated from and the story behind it. The children used the digits 1-9 on a 3x3 grid to make the number 15 horizontally, vertically and diagonally. They then progressed to making the number 45 in pairs (children worked out to multiply

original answers by 3). Mrs Saleh then showed the children Dürer's art piece where a 4x4 square was used to make the number 34. The children then had to find 2x2 grids within Dürer's original art piece to make 34. They really enjoyed the session and showed our Lammack values of determination and resilience to ensure they found the answers.

In the afternoon, throughout school, all the children focused on money. There were lots of opportunities to develop their knowledge of money in everyday situations, handle real money and talk about money. The children had a fantastic time practically developing their mathematical skills that they can use in everyday life.

In Reception the children focused on the story 'The Great Pet Sale,' they bought a range of cuddly toys from the Lammack pet shop using 10p and 1p coins, applying their knowledge of place value and teens numbers. They also looked closely at coins and made some coin rubbings.

In Year 1 the children had a treasure hunt to set the scene. They had a carousel of activities: of how to make an amount of money in different ways. They also produced some coin rubbings to spot differences in coins and which coins are magnetic.

In Year 2 and 2HT the children worked on a carousel of activities, including coin rubbings, using tills and real money to buy objects and give change, played money games and used the laptops to make amounts.

Year 3 had a competition in their Kagan groups to find different combinations of the same amount of money, they then created posters to show their findings, including diagrams of the different amounts.



4H investigated if they could afford some exciting toys and games from a toy shop. They had to choose 3 items then work out how much they cost. They then found out how much money they had been given. And worked out how they could change their wish list so that they could afford something.

4F and 4M worked in their Kagan teams to solve a challenge from Miss Clarke. They had to create and cost out a sports day for KS1. They were given a specification to work to and a budget to spend.

In 5M maths group, the children had to calculate the cost of a new carpet. They had four options and had to decide which one was the best value for money. Their first job was to measure the classroom. They then had to calculate and compare prices.

In 5E maths group the children investigated exchange rates and created line graphs showing the value of the pound to three other currencies.

The children really enjoyed the practical mathematical activities and there was a real buzz around the school.
