Action	SLA competitions agreement	£850
Impact	Children across both KS1 and KS2 are provided with the opportunity to participate in festivals and competitions throughout the year, linking with the extra-curricular activities they participate in. All children who have participated in these competitions have said they enjoy the experience and look forward to these events. We have also seen an increase in the ability of children in these events, which has led to an improvement and qualification in a variety of different sports.	
Action	Sports Apprentice from Lancashire FA	£13000
Impact	In school we have had a sports apprentice from Lancashire FA attending 4 days a week. He has run a variety of after school clubs throughout the year. He has also been team teaching with our members of staff, allowing them to learn and develop from each other. Our after school clubs have focussed on upcoming events, and through providing more practice to participants, we have been able to achieve higher placed finishes in competitions as a result. We have also tried to provide a variety of different sporting activities to all children to try and engage them in physical activity. Our sports apprentice has also run lunch time activities for the children on the playground, and has aimed to engage children who have been identified as needing to improve their levels of participation and fitness.	
Action	PE Subject Leader Release Time	£3200
Impact	Our PE Subject leader has been released for an afternoon each week in order to monitor and develop different areas of sport throughout school, this includes attending cluster meetings, mentoring our apprentice, planning new, competitive sports days, and attending various sporting competitions throughout the year.	
Action	Various equipment replacement and upgrade	£500
Impact	Children now have more equipment to use in both KS1 and KS2 at break times, increasing opportunities for developing skills away from guided lessons. We also have increased the amount and variety of equipment available for PE lessons, which improves the quality of teaching in PE and gives teachers more opportunities to increase the amount of time a child spends learning with equipment individually rather than sharing.	

Action	Transport to a variety of different sporting events throughout the year	£100
Impact	This has allowed us to provide opportunities for a greater number of children to attend and participate in a wider variety of competitions, linked to our objective of developing a competitive ethos throughout the school.	
Action	Provision of fruit for all KS2 pupils once per week.	£1200
Impact	In order to improve the amount of healthy eating in school, we have provided children with a healthy snack three days per week. Not only has this benefitted the children in their diet, but also it has promoted the importance of eating healthily and more children are eating fruit as a result.
