

Literacy:

This term in literacy our main focus will be on stories, we will be looking at a range of stories with under the sea settings. We will be focusing on the concepts of stories such as beginning, middle and end. We will also be looking at the conventions of sentences and working a lot on punctuation. It is very important that your child understands and uses capital letters and full stops in sentences correctly. We are also beginning to look at question marks, exclamation marks and commas in lists.



We believe that if a child can not say a sentence clearly and accurately they will not be able to record it, therefore we will be doing a large number of speaking and listening activities. Throughout the term we will also be looking at instructions, information texts, poetry and traditional tales with a twist.

Reading and phonics:

Reading and phonics are very high on our agenda this year. We teach a different phonics sound each day and also revisit previous learnt sounds throughout the week. It is important that children can phonetically read words so that they can then start to apply the sounds to their writing. The sounds we learn within the week will link to your child's weekly spelling test. Children will be given a phonics test in the Summer term so every opportunity to practise their phonics is vital.

Your child will also continue to read individually twice a week. Please make sure you sign your child's reading record with the page number each time you read.

Classroom Organisation:

Homework- Homework is sent out on a Thursday or Friday to be handed in by the following Tuesday. Please complete any writing in pen and mathematics or drawing in pencil.

Spellings- Spellings are tested every Wednesday and the score sheet will be sent home on a Friday for you to see how your child has done.

Water bottle- Please make sure your child brings their water bottle each day with their name clearly labelled.

Autumn Term in 2HT

Our new topic this term is Down in the Deep.

Maths:

Our main focus in maths this term will be number and place value. It is important for your child to understand numbers and their value.



We will be looking at counting in steps of 1 and 10 both forwards and backwards and recognising the counting pattern. We have noticed that children are struggling with counting backwards so please help them to practise at home.

We will learn new calculation strategies for both addition and subtraction. It is important that the children recognise the symbols + - and =.

It is important that your child is able to explain how they worked out their answers using the correct mathematical vocabulary, so we will be doing a lot of discussion in this area. It is vital that your child knows their number families to 10 and can recognise relationships between numbers.

Top Tips:

- Before starting a new reading book, discuss what type of book you think it is and how you know. Use the language fiction (story) and non fiction (information). Discussion is the key to understanding in year 1! Please do not rush through the books and spend longer talking about them with your child.
- Count forwards and backwards in steps of 1 and 10.
- Recognise the different coins in your purse.
- Count the pennies and ten pence coins using your times tables.
- Put the spelling words in clear sentences ensuring that your child uses a capital letter and a full stop.

Other Areas of the Curriculum:

Science - We will be learning about animals and their habitats, particularly those which live in the ocean. Children will also be taking part in scientific investigations to ask and answer questions about floating and sinking.



Geography - In geography we will be learning about the four countries of the United Kingdom, in particular the capital city of London. We are also focusing on the local environment around the school.



History - In history we will be learning about significant individuals including Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale.



Art - In art we will be looking at different sculptures and the sculptor Anthony Gormley. We will be creating our very own sculptures!



Computing- In computing we will be getting familiar with the computer keyboard, learning to save and open files as well as e-safety.



RE - In RE we will be thinking about Islam and what Muslims believe. We will think about how these beliefs link to our school values.



Music - In music we will be learning to sing songs expressively and perform songs with actions. We will learn and use different instruments.



HRE- In HRE we will be learning about keeping our bodies safe both inside and out. We will discuss water safety, fire safety, safety in the home and what makes us feel safe inside.



Our class charity is NSPCC. We will be discussing the importance of charity this half term and thinking of ideas to raise money.
