#### WHAT CHILDREN WILL NEED

#### ALL children will need:

- Their book bag, reading book and personal organiser in school every day.
- Children to wear their sports' kit on a Tuesday and Wednesday as half of the class will do both indoor PE and outdoor games over the 2 days with the sports coach or the class teacher. Children can bring a roll-on deodorant.
- Please note: no jewellery (including earrings or amulets), no smart watches must be worn.

#### READING

- Children are expected to read <u>daily</u> at home with an adult and parents should question children in order to ensure their understanding – language and structure of texts; author's intent; inference; retrieval; meaning of words in context – encourage use of dictionaries.
- Children will have opportunities to read every day.
- Children requiring additional support with their reading will receive this daily in school.

For the sats – the domains that the children are tested on the most are:

The meaning of words and phrases (20%)
Direct retrieval (42%)
Inference (36%)

## **READING TEST**

- I paper, I hour 3 passages to read (50 marks)
- Types of questions:
  - Ranking/ordering
  - Labelling
  - Find and copy
  - Short responses (retrieval)
  - Longer open ended responses (explanation and backing up with evidence from the text)

 How did Fiona's accident change the way that she felt about her grandpa? Explain your answer carefully, giving evidence from the text.

## GRAMMAR AND SPELLING TEST

- Paper I Grammar and Punctuation 45 minutes (50 marks)
  - Selected responses (tick/circle)

  - Paper 2 aural spelling test (20 words)

## **WRITING**

- We have high expectations in the quality of children's presentation in all of the children's work –including homework.
- We are continuing our drive on correct pen grip and handwriting by Year 6 all children should be joining their handwriting. If children are not joining and producing legible handwriting, then they will be assessed as 'Working Towards' the expected level.




## EXAMPLE OF A 3 MARK REASONING QUESTION

- We use the previous SATs' papers to assess the children throughout the year.
- These are important as they show us areas that the children need more work.
- Please <u>DO NOT</u> use any papers from 2016 onwards with the children.

#### **ASSESSMENTS**

- Throughout the year, we will be carrying out 3 assessments autumn 1, spring 1 and spring 2.
- These are twofold:
- To give the children the experience and practise managing their own time during the sats tests;
- To enable the teachers to tailor interventions for the children.
- Please remember that these are end of year 6 tests and until the spring term, there are areas of the curriculum that we still will not have covered.
