- Keep parents informed through class newsletters, facebook, and the school gateway.
- Provide early notice of problems concerning work or behaviour.

Home School Agreement

As a parent/carer I will:

- Make sure that my child attends school regularly, reporting any absences as soon as possible and make sure my child arrives and is collected on time.
- Contact the class teacher or the Head teacher if there is a problem.
- Attend Parents' Evenings and discussions about my child's progress at school.
- Encourage my child to follow the 'golden rules' and support the school behaviour policy, which includes strategies for dealing with bullying and racist taunts.
- Support my child in his/her homework, daily reading and promote opportunities for home learning.
- Make sure that my child wears the correct uniform, including P.E. kit., and no severe hairstyles, no jewellery.
- Ensure all emergency contact details, consent forms, medical forms and medicines required in school are kept up to date.
- Be respectful to other adults and children
